
The Smethwick Puppetry Festival 2026 programme is officially LIVE - and booking is now open! 😊

ARTIST OPPORTUNITY




Spectra is expanding its shadowing artist programme for learning disabled and autistic creatives who would like to develop their leadership skills and gain more experience in running creative workshops.

Community groups and organisations interested in local arts, heritage, and history.


CIC's working with first-generation migrants and community groups and organisations interested in stories of migration.


