

This year they have been successful in receiving two grants from The National Archives!



A storytelling performance, performed by one agtor who skilfully animates various puppets and props to weave together all the differing stories to greate a funny, anarchic, moving and beautiful journey through various gultures and makes for visually stunning theatre.

THIS IS A 45 MINUTE PERFORMANGE AND TWO SHOWS AT THE SAME VENUE GAN BE PRESENTED IN ONE DAY AND IS FLEXIBLE REGARDING PERFORMANGE DELIVERY SO WE GAN MEET THE NEEDS OF FESTIVALS, SCHOOLS, GOLLEGES, AND ARTS VENUES. THE PERFORMANGE IS SUITABLE FOR FAMILIES AND FOR ALL AGES OVER 5 YEARS

THE TOYMAKER IS TECHNICALLY SELF-SUFFICIENT AND TOURS WITH IT'S OWN SOUND EQUIPMENT AND LICHTING AND WOULD REQUIRE AGGESS TO AT LEAST 4 X ISAMP SOCKETS. FOR VENUES WITH THEIR OWN FIXED LICHTING RIG A WARM GENERAL GOVER IS REQUESTED AS IS LARGER VENUES WITH IN HOUSE PA SYSTEMS WE MAY REQUIRE TO RUN OUR SOUND THROUGH.

PERFORMANCE SPACE NEEDED IS 4M DEPTH X 5M WIDTH MINIMUM, WITH 8M HEIGHT, AND IS AN END ON PERFORMANCE.






## You're Invited to Multistory's Journal Launch!
